Ms Frichot, who is well known to the children will take classes in week 8, and Dos Santos is due to return to school in Week 9.</li> <li>Mrs Sampson (Science Specialist) has resigned her position due to ill-health. The position will be advertised to fill permanently in the near future</li> <li>We had our School Review last Wednesday. Director of Public Schools, Ms Maxine Augustson and peer reviewer, Ms Leonie Clelland (Principal, Karrinyup PS) spent the day with us, meeting with staff, parents and students.
