	Administration  Current enrolments sit at 432. We have 42 students coming into Kindy next year, and 56 students exiting Year 6. Funding-wise this is causing some headaches. The issue is that number in Early Childhood are low, but they have increased in Years 1-6 to the extent that we need to run an additional class. We are accepting out of area enrolments ATM and we will have places in all year levels.  The Colour Run was a huge success, and I'd like to thank everyone who was involved in that event. I have an idea for a P&C project for fund raising next year.  A big job is underway between Room 5 and the canteen. It is necessary to replace the canteen fat-trap, and this requires a \$50,000+ plumbing/drain upgrade. Contractors will be here for the next three weeks carrying out the works.  Our Night of Celebration is on Wednesday of Week 8 – 29th November. We're		
	hoping the P&C support to make this an evening to remember.  Students

We are still watering 3 times a day, to enable it to become well established. Alan, (backfill gardener) recently fertilised the turf that was laid in the Christmas holidays so we're hoping to see emerald green re-growth in the area before too long.
