Principal's News

At Booragoon Primary School we want all children to achieve their very best. Our attendance tracking has revealed some concerning data that suggests there may have been a shift in the importance society places on school attendance. 'Regular' school attendance in the WA system denotes 90% attendance, or children missing no more than one day of school per fortnight. Prior to COVID, in 2019, Booragoon PS had 86.3% of students in the 'Regular' category. In Semester Two last year, we had 70.1% in this category, which means over that period one third of our students had more than a day a fortnight off school.

Developing a habit of going to school every day is vitally important so children do not miss out on the important concepts and skills that they need for future learning. Of course, there are times when students cannot attend school due to illness, and this is to be expected.

Many concepts in Literacy and Numeracy are taught in a sequence of building blocks. Missing school means missing out on learning – and it can be difficult to catch up later. This is especially important when essential foundation skills are being taught.

'Showing up' is also an important life skill, whether it be to school, to sporting activities, and to other commitments.

(NAPLAN) NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - LITERACY AND NUMERACY

NAPLAN testing for our Year 3 and Year 5 students begins next Wednesday and continues until Monday 25th March. This week Mr Godwin is overseeing practise tests so our students are familiar with the types of questions and the online test environment. There is no need for them to feel any anxiety or pressure related to NAPLAN. These are not high stakes assessments, the purpose is to provide governments with a snapshot in time of student performance across the nation that can be used to inform educational programs and funding distribution.

We expect our students to approach the tests in the same way they approach any of the activities they carry out regularly as part of their learning program.


On Thursday 22nd February the kindy and pre-primary students took part in a kids and dads event facilitated by Mike Lee from Kids'n'Sport.
