WALK / RIDE / SKATE / SCOOT TO SCHOOL DAY

Now in its 25th year, National Walk Safety to School Day is an annual event when all Primary School children will be encouraged to walk/ride/skate/scoot to school.

Tomorrow is Walk/Ride/Skate/Scoot 2 School Day. This is a nation-wide program which encourages students to get physically active on their journey to school. Some 350,000 students across Australia will participate in the program this year. In the 1970s four out of five students rode or walked to school every day; today it's only one in five. If the inactivity continues 1 in 2 children will become obese as adults. Students who actively travel arrive at school awake and alert, improving their concentration in class and their ability to understand the curriculum. Other objectives include:

- Parents/carers walking to school with primary aged children reinforces safe pedestrian behaviour
- Reduce car dependency habits that can be instilled at an early age
- Reduce the level of air pollution created by motor vehicles
- Reduce of the level of traffic congestion.

Let's all put in a big effort to travel to school 'other than in a car' and make it a habit (which in fact a cohort of our students already do!).

PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Unfortunately the issue of parents parking illegally at drop-off and pick-up time has again arisen. I find it incomprehensible that some of our parents are so disrespectful of the rights of others that they continue to park in our neighbour's driveways and on their verges. This week one neighbour on The Ramble had her driveway blocked two days running, and she was unable to respond to a call out from her elderly mother. It appears that some people believe this is acceptable, however, according to the Local Government Act 1995 the following is the case:

Traffic Obstructions

- 26. A Person shall not stand or park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is:
 - (a) in front of a right of way, passage or private drive, or so close to one as to deny vehicles reasonable access to, or egress from, the passage or private drive;
 - (e) on or over a footpath or a place of refuge for pedestrians.
- 27. (1) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a street verge where signs prohibit the standing or parking of vehicles on that verge
 - (2) A person, not being the occupier of the land abutting on to a street verge, shall not without consent of that occupier, drive, park or stand a vehicle upon that verge.

Let's all be good neighbours and set a good example to our children by being good citizens.



P&C FUNDRAISING FOR 2024

As you may recall, the P&C ran a parent survey at the end of 2023, to gauge where parents would like to see the P&C funds spent. We received some very valuable feedback from this survey, and we determined that most parents would like to see some additional shade/shelter near the canteen/undercover area.

However, since the survey, we have received a request from the school if the P&C can assist in updating the classroom air conditioners, which are very old, evaporative units. As clearly evidenced at times this term, some of these units are not very effective in extreme heat! After discussion among the P&C members, we have decided that this is where our fundraising focus is going to be. We will start by conducting a review to determine the scope of requirements (some classrooms have newer, more efficient systems). Due to the anticipated cost, we expect that this will require a staged rollout, over a number of years. We are also speaking to the state government for funding assistance, which may help speed up the rollout.

We will provide further updates on this initiative, as it progresses. Additionally, we will retain the information collated in the survey, and when/where possible, we hope to revisit this.
